

Access to Donor Milk Act

HMBANA has led an advocacy effort in Congress to introduce a bill to support nonprofit donor milk at the federal level. The bill, the Access to Donor Milk Act, has been introduced in the House and Senate by a bipartisan group of Members of Congress. The legislation would:

- Allow state agencies to use Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) funding to promote the need for and benefits of donor milk, and allow WIC funds to support donor milk activities in states;
- Provide emergency capacity funding (\$3 million) for milk banks, in the event there is a rapid increase in demand for donor milk, as occurred during the 2022 formula shortage;
- Create a donor milk awareness program at the Department of Health and Human Services (\$1 million) to educate the public on donor milk and nonprofit milk banks, and to publicize the need for donor milk; and
- Require the Secretary of Health and Human Services to draft guidance that addresses appropriate standards for collection, processing, handling, transfer, and storage of donor milk. It also requires the Secretary to convene a public meeting to inform this guidance.
