Here in the Pacific Northwest, daffodils are in bloom! And our juniper and alder trees are already releasing their pollen into the air. So, if you are experiencing itchy eyes, runny nose and/or sneezing, here are examples of the acceptable medications for our milk donors:

- Non-Sedating Antihistamines: Allegra (fexofenadine), Claritin (loratadine), and Zyrtec (cetrizine)
- Nasal Sprays: Flonase, Nasacort, Nasonex, Rhinocort
- · Inhalers: Albuterol, Advair
- Allergy Shots

Should you need to take another medication not listed above, please let us know.

Q: Do you charge hospitals and outpatients for the milk?

A: We do not charge for the milk itself. We charge a processing fee which helps to cover some of the expenses of screening our donors and processing the milk to ensure its safety.

Q: What if a family can't afford to pay for the milk?

A: When a medical need exists, special financial arrangements can be made. We would never turn a family away that has a baby with a medical need.

Q. Is a prescription required?

A. Yes. A prescription from the baby's doctor is required.
